Board Meeting


The next board meeting will be Monday, December 21st at 6:30am at Perkins.

THE PROGRAM

Tuesday's program was provided by Annette Richie. Annette, also known as Grandma Richie to many, works with the Dazzlers dance team. Dazzlers is a Christian dance team that teaches young girls dance techniques. Dazzlers is unique because while it emphasizes correct dance techniques, team work and building character are the main objectives of the teachers and others involved with Dazzlers. The staff and teachers use positive reinforcement to help build the girls' self esteem and help them realize that they are capable of anything they put their mind to.

The Dazzlers compete in one competition in January and host a spring show in May. This year the spring show will be held the last Friday in May at Free State high school.

Dazzlers dancers are any girl be-

tween the ages of 3 and 18 that are interested in dancing. The fee for being a Dazzler is much lower than normal dance team fees. In order to keep costs down, volunteers and parent help make costumes and scenery. Each girl and their family is responsible for paying for one costume and one uniform. All of the rest of the outfits are made by volunteers and parents or are recycled. There are approximately 120 girls involved in Dazzlers.

While the girls only pay \$100 it costs close to \$600 a year for each girl that participates. Dazzlers does a fundraiser in the fall and sells ads in their spring show book.
