On 6-Jan-2001, I left the Hawaii resort hotel that hosted our HICSS-34 Conference. My auto route to Maui's Airport took me past the Pacific Disaster Center's OpS Center where I had a VIP briefing on their innovative GIS-based CincPAC-DoD Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Recovery (HA/DR) mission.

I planned to spend a few days on Oahu enroute to Bloomington, MN with Ron Takata to learn about his creative Honolulu Community College Science Club. Enroute to his Makalapa home near Wahiawa, I also visited Ford Island where I supported ComThirdFlt special projects with NRSAND V-12 at NAS Twin Cities.

My U.S. Naval Reserve (USNR) active duty assignment s (1966-71) included both USS Cimarron (AO-22) and Fleet Operations Control Center Pacific (FOCCPAC) before completing Information Science graduate studies at UH-Manoa (Hawaii).
